1. a) Find the general solution of the following linear system, identifying your coefficient matrix $A$, the rhs vector $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}$, the augmented matrix, the rref matrix and the vector form $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{x}}=\ldots$ of the solution.
$x_{1}+2 x_{2}+3 x_{3}+4 x_{5}=-1$
$2 x_{1}+3 x_{2}+5 x_{3}+x_{4}+7 x_{5}=0$
$3 x_{1}+x_{2}+5 x_{3}+5 x_{4}+7 x_{5}=7$
b) Identify a basis of the solution space of the related homogeneous system corresponding to setting $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}=\overrightarrow{\mathbf{0}}$.
c) Consider the set of vectors $\left\{\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{v}}_{1}, \ldots, \overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{v}}_{5}\right\}$ which form the columns of $A$. What are the independent relationships among this vectors? (Write each in the form: a linear combination of them equals the zero vector.)
d) What subset of these vectors does our solution algorithm show to be linearly independent automatically? Express $\boldsymbol{b}$ as a unique linear combination of these latter vectors.
2. Which of the following sets of vectors are linearly independent? Justify your claim. Report the results of any calculation you use in doing so.
a) $\{\langle\langle 3,-2,1\rangle|\langle 6,1,0\rangle|\langle 0,-5,2\rangle\rangle\}$
b) $\{\langle 2,1,-3\rangle|\langle 4,0,1\rangle|\langle 7,1,-1\rangle\}$
c) $\{\langle 3,-2,1,1\rangle|\langle 6,1,0,2\rangle|\langle 0,-5,2,3\rangle\}$ [Hint: Cursor in any last row entry, "Control Shift R" will add a column to an existing matrix.]
