1. Given: 
$$\lambda_1 = -\frac{1}{2} + 3 I$$
,  $\lambda_2 = -\frac{1}{2} - 3 I$ ,  $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}_1 = \langle 1 - 3 I, 1 \rangle$ ,  $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}_2 = \langle 1 + 3 I, 1 \rangle$ ,  $B = \langle \overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}_1 | \overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{b}}_2 \rangle$ 

- a) Evaluate the real and imaginary parts of  $z = e^{\lambda_I t}$ .
- b) Evaluate the real and imaginary parts of  $\vec{z} = e^{\lambda_l t} \vec{b}_1 = \vec{x} + I \vec{y}$ .
- c) Let  $\overrightarrow{u} = a \overrightarrow{x} + b \overrightarrow{y}$ . Solve the condition  $\overrightarrow{u}(0) = \langle 2, -1 \rangle$  for (a, b), backsubstitute into  $\overrightarrow{u}$  and simplify.
- d) Express the sinusoidal factor in each vector component of  $\overrightarrow{u}$  in phase shifted form.
- e) Plot  $u_1$  and  $u_2$  versus t (use the original expressions, not the phase-shifted ones) for 5 characteristic times of the exponential factor starting at t = 0, including the envelopes of both decaying oscillations.
- f) Which of these two functions peaks earlier in time? Explain your reasoning.
- g) What fraction of a cycle separates these peaks? How many peaks do you see in the viewing window for each function?
- h) Evaluate  $A = B \begin{bmatrix} \lambda_1 & 0 \\ 0 & \lambda_2 \end{bmatrix} B^{-1}$ , then use Maple to solve the IVP  $\overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{u}} = A \overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{u}}, \overrightarrow{\boldsymbol{u}}(0) = \langle 2, -1 \rangle$  as a check on your work.
